PERENNIALS



Lily of the valley
(*Convallaria majalis*)

Propagation

Cover of the plant.
H 1-2 1/2 ft.; S 2 ft. or more.

Lily of the valley (*Convallaria*)
Sprays of fragrant, white or
pinkish, bell-shaped flowers
bloom in spring; old favorite of
gardeners. Best as shady ground
cover. Fruit poisonous. H 6-8 in.;
S 2 ft. or more.

C. majalis, white, 6-8 in. The following are only rarely
available:
C. m. floreplena, double, white, 6-8 in.
C. m. fortunei (Fortune's giant), white, 1 ft.
C. m. rosea, pink, 6-8 in.
C. m. striata, white, variegated leaves, 6-8 in.

Plant rootstocks (pipes) in
humus-enriched soil in shaded
location. Plants respond to fer-
tilizer by producing more and
larger flowers; apply after tops
die down. Use about 3 handfuls of
organic fertilizer per 10 sq. ft.

Divide in single
crowns in early
fall; divisions
seldom need
and only after
flowering
deteriorates.
